

## 1 Flower Lanes

*Starting at the Village Hall on Front Street, walk north easterly towards the church, past the bus stop and phone box, then turn left down Manor Road.*

Along Front Street you will find many edible and sensory plants in the herbary, polyculture areas and perennial flower verges.

## 2 Playing Field

*Follow the road until you reach Pig Lane, turn right sign-posted to the Playing Field. Go around the bend and the field will be on your left.*

Within the playing field is a birch and alder micro-wood and a massive new wildlife hedge. There is a delicious selection of raspberries to munch on whilst you lay in the middle of the woven willow dome. Look out for the Hedgehog House under the Bug Hotel.

## 3 Whittling Wood

*Leaving the fields, turn left and follow the track towards the church. The coppice can be found running along the churchyard wall.*

Behind the church is a place for reflection, snuggled in by the big old beech tree is a copse planted with wild cherry, silver birch, rowan and hazel.

## 4 Community Orchard

*Walk along the footpath parallel to the wall and continue past the row of houses. Turn right down the path by Springfield Cottages and then left onto Ward Lane, keep walking until you come to the orchard on Greens Corner.*

With apple, plum, pear, greengage and shipova to choose from there's something for everyone. Look out for Clapp's Favourite and the Bloody Ploughman!

## 5 Foraging Lanes

*Continue along Ward Lane past Pennwood Farm and turn right on to the bridleway. Follow the track until the 3rd gate on your right, go through the gate onto the footpath and walk straight ahead, go through the next gate by the bench and continue past the foraging lane. Continue on the footpath towards the village until the barns and turn left. Continue walking past the sweet chestnut trees and turn right down Sibley's Farm Lane. Walk past the rosemary bank until you reach Front Street, turn right and it will take you back to the Village Hall.*

Coming back towards the village are 3 new horse chestnut trees, a fabulous native foraging hedge, standing alder and a bank of holly trees. Look out for the juniper bank and the stand of sweet chestnut trees on the homeward stretch...
