## Views from the Vicarage



Dear Friends,

September is here, and for the community thoughts at this time of year turn to Harvest Festivals, as we give thanks to God for his goodness to us and the wonder of the natural cycle of the seasons.

The world at large seems to be getting more and more complicated. As I watch the news today, Sunday 1<sup>st</sup> September, the Americans seem to have pulled back from the brink - at least for the time being - of launching a strike on Syria. There are moral arguments being espoused both for and against such action. What I find most interesting is that if you follow the middle eastern politics, the Arab world is divided in its opinions - not just on Syria, but across all the issues in their various countries.

What has all this got to do with the Christian faith? The countries that are divided are the natural enemies of Israel. If you read the Old Testament you will find time and time again God is seen as causing the enemies of Israel to become confused, and often implode on themselves. There is talk of the possibility of Armageddon, which of course comes from the Bible - in fact it is referring to the valley of Har Meggido in Northern Israel. This is the crossing point of all the trade routes in the ancient Middle East.

Central to the Christian faith is the return of Jesus Christ. Jesus acknowledges that as humans we observe and understand the natural seasons, but give us a clear warning about watching the signs of the times. I am not about to proclaim the imminent return of Jesus Christ - though I pray for it daily. However, in relating the news to a good knowledge of the scripture, as all who say they believe should be able to do, I wonder what is happening. It is certainly a call to watch the times and seasons, and pray as Jesus commanded. Of course a biblical perspective is also needed in these challenging times.

## PARISH COUNCIL

*Extracts from meeting held on Tuesday 2<sup>nd</sup> July 2013*

### *Matters arising from the previous minutes*

- Members Interest Forms. Only one still to be returned.
- Street Signs. A new sign for St. Marys Close had now been ordered by SDC Clean Surroundings, and this would be erected in due course.

### *County Councillor's report*

Cllr. Hall was away at the Local Government Conference, so no report was given.

### *Sedgemoor District Council report*

Cllr. Alder, reported on the following items:

- News had been received this week of a further impending cut in the Central Government grant to local councils of 10% on top of the stringent cuts already imposed.
- Planning. A new simplified system was to be introduced covering extensions to private dwellings.
- New Bridgwater Hospital. A new extension was already being planned.

### *Planning*

- Application No. 18/13/000003  
Applicant: Accommodate Ltd and AJB (South West) Ltd  
Location: Land at Dolton's Farm, Front Street  
Proposal: Application to vary condition 1 of Planning Permission 18/12/000002 to replace plans on schedule A list, relating to garages and floor plans for Plots 1 and 2 and alterations to elevations to Plots 1,2,3 and 4.  
Decision: Granted Permission.  
Decision Level: Delegate Case Officer: Chris Gom.

### *Correspondence*

- Playing Field Planning Application: To install new play equipment. The Playing Field Association have been advised by Sedgemoor Planning Department that the fee for them applying for the necessary planning permission would be greatly reduced if the application were made by the Parish Council. After discussing the matter, a motion was passed agreeing that the Clerk be allowed to submit the Planning Application on behalf of the Chedzoy Playing Field Association.

### *Finance*

Details of various cheques issued were given.

Parish Council balances were as follows:

Current Account	£ 7,696.48
Deposit Account	£2.48
Nat West Bond	£12,064.04

The Current Account balance included the Defibrillator grant of £1,940.00.

Nat West Enhanced Bond interest query. The amount of interest earned on the £11,700 Bond - which had been invested for a year at 3.25% - had been queried since the £313.39 received seemed to be about £67 short. A detailed response is awaited from the Bank, but there was a £50.04 credit to the NatWest Bond c/a marked *interest compensation* - which was still short of the amount expected. Developments are awaited here.

#### **Any Other Business**

- Neighbourhood Policing Awards. Details of these were read out, and it was felt that the local PCSO was doing such a good job that she was deserving of consideration under the section 'PCSO of the year'. A number of leaflets were distributed for individuals to take matters forward.
- Sedgemoor District council annual get together with Parishes. This year's event would be held on Wednesday November 6<sup>th</sup> from 6 to 8 p.m.
- Defibrillator arrangements. Terry Matthews of Stawell Parish Council had again been telephoned in an attempt to establish a timetable for this and the necessary training etc. here. Assurance had been given that matters would proceed in the next month.
- Parish Pothole Liaison Officer. Cllr. Smith advised the meeting that he had now been trained and had been issued with a hand held computer by the County Council. He had asked if he could also report problems outside the village boundary, but close by – e.g. Rugg's Drove and Chedzoy Lane - and had obtained permission to do so.
- SIDs. The Clerk wondered if this had been installed as promised in June, and Cllr Alder advised that the scheme was well behind schedule, partly due to vandalism and the theft of the devices in the neighbourhood.

#### **Extracts from meeting held on Tuesday 27<sup>th</sup> August**

##### **Matters arising from the previous minutes**

- Defibrillator and First Aid Training. As there was still no contact from Terry Matthews of Stawell it was agreed to approach St John's Ambulance for help in this matter.
- Speed Indicator Device. Chedzoy qualifies to be included in the programme and will be receiving a SID on a regular 4 monthly basis for a period of 2 weeks per installation, starting week commencing 16<sup>th</sup> September.

##### **County Councillor's report**

Cllr. Hall, reported on the following items:

- Hinkley Point. The Electricity Strike Price agreement was still 'some way off'.
- Bower Lane closure. This three-month closure, though inconvenient, is necessary, and may result in increased traffic passing through the village as an alternative route.
- Bradney Lane 40 mph speed limit. Although just outside the village, the 40 mph speed limit on the A39 was likely to be extended down Bradney Lane towards Bawdrip.

##### **Planning**

- Ref: 18/13/00004/DRT. Applicant:- Mrs C Lockstone, Location: - School House, Front Street, TA7 8RE. Proposal:- Erection of a single storey extension to South (Side) elevation to include garage, demolition of existing garage. Decision: Application supported.

##### **Correspondence**

- Footpath at NCN 3 off-road section along Kings Sedgemoor Drain. Members of the public had complained about deterioration - during winter 2012/13 large areas of standing water formed in dips in the path with water unable to drain

west into the river due to blocked or non-existent channels, and the surface of the path had washed away in many places. Rupert Crosby of Sustrans had acknowledged the issues and stated that a possible solution may be to raise the path on a low causeway with drainage underneath. Funds for maintenance are limited but channels can be cleared easily enough with volunteer labour. Mr Crosby is consulting and will advise further in due course.

- Fuel Loan Scheme. This scheme was open to individuals where total household income was less than £35,000 pa, with interest free loans being available over 6 months to a maximum £500. Poster being displayed.
- Rural Services Network – Petition for Fairer Funding of Local Councils. Ian Liddell-Grainger, MP, was seeking signatures to a petition calling for the Rural Penalty to be reduced from 50% to 40% by 2020. The Rural Penalty sees rural areas receive 50% less grant per head than rural councils, but rural residents earn less on average than those in cities, pay Council Tax which is on average £100 more per head, and see urban areas receive Government grants 50% higher per head than those in the countryside. Petition forms were distributed.

##### **Finance**

Details of various cheques issued were given.

Parish Council balances were as follows:

Current Account	£ 7,452.18
Deposit Account	£2.48
Nat West Enh Bus Bond	£12,013.39 (at 1% for 1 year)
Nat West Bus Bond c/a	£50.65

£50 received – with an apology - from NatWest was compensation for their error in deducting income tax from last year's fixed rate interest on maturity. The Clerk had acknowledged the compensation, but told NW that it was somewhat inadequate when considering all the bother and work it had caused the council – reply awaited.

A request had been received from Sedgemoor CAB for grant aid, stating the current recession represented a 'perfect storm' to the Bureau, because at a time when more and more people needed their help, their funding is coming under more and more pressure. After a discussion it was agreed to send a donation of £50 as had been done in the previous two years.

##### **Any Other Business**

- Cluster Group. Cllr. Pat Lennard reported on the recent meeting at Middlezoy. She said there were some changes to RTL2 funds from next January, so the Clerk was asked to draw this to the attention of the Playing Field association in connection with their pending grant application - £6,372.60 of RTL2 money having been earmarked for it.
- Parking in the Village. The problem of more and more vehicles being parked all over the Village causing partial obstruction to the highway was discussed. Cllr Pat Lennard said that CPSO Helen Whitehead was aware of the problem but was currently on annual leave and would be looking into it on her return.
- Wessex Water spreading human waste on land occupied by Gillards of Burrowbridge, with its accompanying bad smell. The Clerk was asked to take the matter up with Wessex Water.
- Potholes in Chedzoy Lane near Crowe Lane and near Temple Farm. Mr. Richard Woodward complained strongly about these potholes, saying very little had been done and people were experiencing serious damage to the tyres of their vehicles. The Clerk was asked to take the matter up again with SCC (Laurence Hackling).

## Free Prescription Collection Service

There are some leaflets on the Notice Board in the Village Hall provided by Superdrug Pharmacy in Bridgwater - 01278 423 055 - which advertise a free prescription collection service. They explain the procedure, which has four easy steps:

- Check your surgery participates in the scheme. Your Superdrug pharmacy will know. Complete the form in the leaflet and hand it in at the pharmacy counter.
- The pharmacy will get permission from your surgery, and will arrange to collect your regular prescription for you on your behalf.
- Order your repeat prescription in the usual way - either at your surgery or at the pharmacy.
- The pharmacy will pick up your prescription, and within 72 hours of your request your medication will be ready for you to collect at the pharmacy.

The Superdrug Pharmacy also operates a free DELIVERY service, which delivers medicines to Chedzoy on Wednesday of each week. You can sign up for *this* service when you enrol in the free collection service described above.
