

## Views from the Vicarage

Dear Friends,

I wonder if you have a song from school sticks in your mind. So often when looking music for a wedding the couple remember song from Assembly. One of the songs that recurs frequently is 'Give me oil in my lamp' - that's the first line of the fourth verse.

Where do these songs come from? This song is a traditional song whose author is unknown. The words are a prayer to God. They express, with each successive verse, a longing for what many people want in their lives. The four verses each have a different theme. 'Give me joy in my heart', 'Give me peace in my heart', 'Give me love in my heart', and finally, 'Give me oil in my lamp'.

The purpose for the request is in the second line of each verse. 'Keep me praising', 'Keep me resting,' 'Keep me serving', and 'Keep me burning' - all marks of a Christian life living in a close intimate relationship with Jesus. The chorus says it with the use of the Hebrew word *hosanna* which means 'Praise the Lord'. 'Sing hosanna to the King'. The song is often sung by those who remember it with great gusto which is how it should be sung. The question of course is this? Is it being sung with great gusto because of nostalgia for the school days? Or because it truly expresses a life filled with a burning passion for Jesus?

Oil is fuel. We all need fuel whether we need oil gas or solid particularly when it is cold. We need fuel as food for the body and we need food for the spiritual life! So the song, like so many hymns that are sung - be it a baptism, wedding or a funeral - express a real knowledge of what it is to be in a constant relationship with the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. So I wonder where your spiritual fuel comes from?





Want to do something different? Want to raise money where you live or work? Want to eat Fish and Chips, while raising money for charity? Hold a fish and chip supper on Friday 21st May 2010 whilst raising awareness of spinal cord injury and supporting SIA's information and support services.

You can hold a fish and chip supper in your own home, at work or hold a larger supper at your local community centre. SIA will provide a fundraising pack containing hints and tips, recipes, invitations and donation envelopes. By inviting 7 friends and asking them to donate an additional £5.00 means you will raise at least £35.00 from your supper but we will also give you additional fundraising ideas to raise even more money for SIA. Last year we had over 80 suppers taking part in England and Wales. In 2010 we want to double that figure and ensure we can provide more support to spinal cord injured people.

The money raised from the suppers will help the Spinal Injuries Association offer support to individuals who become paralysed and their families, from the moment a spinal injury occurs, and for the rest of their lives by providing services and publications which enable and encourage paralysed people to lead independent lives. Every year in the UK over 1,000 people experience a spinal cord injury and there are an estimated 40,000 spinal cord injured people in the UK alone.

Community Fundraising Officer, Elizabeth Wright, says, "The Fish and Chip Supper is a wonderful opportunity for a great evening with friends and family. We are also encouraging people who work to hold a Fish and Chip Lunch in their work places to raise even more funds. You may be even a local community group wanting to run a fun evening with your group. Be a part of something special and make a real difference to help spinal cord injured people gain access to the information and support they need to enable them to live full and independent lives."

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## Chedzoy Village Hall

The AGM for the Village Hall Management Committee takes place on Wednesday 24<sup>th</sup> March, at 7:30 pm in the Village Hall. The Management Committee consists of a

number of people elected at each AGM, and representatives from the Village organisations that use the hall on a regular basis. Their collective job is to run the hall on behalf of the villagers of Chedzoy – because the hall belongs to **them!** Yes, if you are a resident of Chedzoy, the hall belongs to you!

For the benefit of anyone not familiar with the history of the Hall, the following paragraphs provide some background:

### History

The hall, which was originally built in 1914, was presented to the village in 1937, by the then Rector, the Reverend George Mullins. When the Village Hall was gifted to the people of Chedzoy, a Trust Deed was set up which identified the Trustees by name and specified how any replacement Trustees should be appointed.

In 1972, this Trust Deed was replaced by a **new** deed, registered with The Charities Commission, which is the regulatory body for charitable trusts in this country. This new deed specified that management of the hall and its associated property would be vested in a **Committee of Management**. This committee to consist of fifteen persons:

Seven Elected Members and  
Eight Representative Members

and that – apart from casual vacancies – the Elected Members should be appointed at an Annual General Meeting. It gave details of the Village organisations providing Representative Members, but allowed that these might change over the years. A maximum of two Representative Members are permitted from each organisation, and their name(s) should be advised to the Management Committee Secretary prior to each AGM.

The Trust Deed also makes it clear that the members of the ‘whole’ Management Committee are the Trustees of the Hall. This is the reason why each of the members of the Management Committee has to sign a document each year signifying that they are willing to act as Trustees of the Hall, for which they all have equal and collective responsibility.

### Ownership

At the time of the new Deed, ownership of the land and the Hall building were **Vested** in the Official Custodian for Charities, and the following extracts explain why this was done.

Charities which are unincorporated, such as trusts or associations, do not have legal identity and cannot hold property (including land) in their own name. Instead it must be held on behalf of the charity by nominated individuals (known as holding trustees, and often in practice one or more of the charity trustees).

In the case of individuals, from time to time these individuals will change (eg due to retirement or death), and new deeds will be required to transfer the property to their successor. However, vesting charity land in the Official Custodian removes this need.

This has two advantages:

- the charity is saved the expense of making the new deeds required when its holding trustees change;
- there is no risk that the charity land will remain vested in people who are no longer involved with the charity and who may be difficult to trace.

The Official Custodian cannot take part in managing land vested in him/her. The charity trustees *keep all the powers and duties of management*.

### AGM

The business of the AGM involves the presentation of reports from the Management Committee, followed by the identification of the Representative Members, and the election of the Elected Members. This latter group usually consists of persons willing to act as Chairman, Vice Chairman, Secretary, and Treasurer, and three other local people who have permanent associations with the village. So, do come along to the AGM – after all, it’s about **your** Village Hall.

### Hall Chair's Annual Report

Thanks must go to the loyal band of stalwarts who always come up trumps in helping to keep the Hall fabric up to scratch, namely, Mr Jim Clapp - who has kept the Hall Field looking quite smart with regular grass cutting, Mr Roy Beal - for retiling in the Kitchen area, Mr Don Johnson (our indomitable Secretary) - for all the other little tasks which need attention. Thanks also to Mrs Carole Edmunds, the Treasurer, who has kept our finances on track.

We are currently applying for a full drinks licence, so that the Village organisations and villagers will not need to apply for Temporary Event Notices (TENS), although there may be a small charge to offset the cost of the full licence. People booking from outside the Village will still have to apply for a TEN in the normal way. I would like to emphasise that it is not our intention to run the Village Hall as an alternative 'drinking den', so the neighbouring properties need not worry.

With the advent of the new Waste Collecting Service, it will be necessary for people using the Hall to **TAKE AWAY ALL FOOD WASTE** after any event, as we will only be supplied with the Black and Green Boxes and a big Blue Wheelie bin which is for all other waste. We regret having to take this action, but otherwise it would mean having to pay the Commercial Rate - which is very expensive and would necessitate an increase in letting charges. Please use the appropriate boxes/bin for non-food waste.
