Extracts from meeting - Monday 13th June

Matters arising from previous meeting's minutes

- **Affordable Housing** Esther Carter and Nick Draper from the Affordable Housing Development Team (AFHDT) at SDC were present, and Esther addressed the meeting - after which she took questions. Chedzoy's Housing Needs Assessment (HNA), carried out in November 2017, had been given an analytical assessment of each individual respondent's housing needs. At that time 6 households were determined to be in housing need; 2 required some form of affordable rented accommodation; and 4 required some form of affordable home ownership.

The next Local Plan, now awaiting a decision of the Secretary of State (possibly by the autumn of 2018), has re-designated Chedzoy as a tier 4 settlement, previously designated as *unsustainable*. Affordable housing aims to allow people access to a suitable home at a price they can afford, where they were born/grew up/have support/social networks or work.

New homes under the scheme will have a *local lettings policy*, something existing council homes do not have. The ratio of affordable homes against market rate homes in any development has not yet been determined but may be of the order of 40%/60%. A minimum of 6 and a maximum of 12 affordable homes is envisaged in the case of Chedzoy

There were many questions from the floor, which were (sometimes) robustly put to Esther.

It is now up to the Parish Council to decide if it wishes to proceed and the first question it has to consider is: *Does Chedzoy Parish Council agree to tackle the affordable housing shortfall in the parish?*

The Chairman suggested any decision on the way forward should be considered at the next meeting on 23rd July.

- **GDPR seminar report** The Clerk reported on this and said data should be handled extremely carefully by the council, with particular areas of care being data held in respect of cemeteries, allotments, payroll (where this was out-sourced) and planning applications (where a good deal of data is held - and with the Local Council archiving these there is no need to keep them at Parish Council level once a decision has been made). It is also good practice not to name parishioners in the minutes. Thankfully there is a new clause in the legislation exempting Parish Councils from the need to employ a GDPR officer. The Clerk's computer is password protected.
- **Parish Bridleways** The parishioner who wrote in about poor state of the parish bridleways was present at the meeting, although Cllr. Katrina Maxwell was not able to attend. A discussion took place with the Chairman sympathising with the problems of gateways being sometimes locked or tied shut, giving walkers or horse riders problems of access - which should be available to all. It was decided to defer further discussion until the next meeting when Cllr. Maxwell could report on her findings.
- **Bus Shelter Garden** Clerk reported the resignation of the caretaker of the garden. Cllr Martin Baker kindly offered to have a look at it. The Clerk will reply thanking the former caretaker for all his work over the years.

Correspondence

- **Fingerpost Restoration Project Training Course** The Clerk read an email from SCC - fingerposts@somerset.gov.uk - which advises they are currently co-ordinating a project aimed at surveying and refurbishing all historic finger post signs within the county. Training is being offered to volunteers at North Petherton Community Centre on Friday 15th June 2018 between 9.30 and 13.30. - Noted.
- **Work Place Pension** With the Clerk recently reaching the age of 65 he had discovered that, as he is not already in a scheme, then he need not be automatically enrolled. Tailored Auto Enrolment has advised that if the Parish Council terminates the agreement the auto enrolment system already in place will be lost. He asked the members to bear with the situation as he has not completed investigations with Legal and General (the insurance company holding the (unused) policy), to see if it could be *frozen* for future use in case of need, and should a new Clerk require enrolment. In the meantime the £13.20 monthly fee should not be cancelled.

- **New Moto-Cycle Track** The Clerk has received an email from someone advising that she has been told by a Chedzoy resident of a new track having been built and used. She says she has seen activity in a field on the right hand side of Chedzoy Lane when looking down from near Mole Valley Farmers. The Chairman has been unable to establish where the site is. The Clerk will reply to the email.
- **Merchant Navy Day 3rd September 2018** We have again been encouraged to mark this by flying the Red Ensign - Noted.

Finance

Details of various cheques issued were given.

The first tranche of the 2018/2019 Precept of £3,748.00 has been received, and the Clerk advised that the necessary paperwork was now in the hands of the accountants carrying out the external audit.

Any Other Business

- **Parish Council Noticeboard** The Clerk said the current village noticeboard was well used and often congested and there were times when he found it extremely difficult to post the notices which are required by statute to be on public view. He was given permission to investigate and report back on the matter.

Extracts from meeting - Monday 23rd July

Matters arising from previous meeting's minutes

- **Affordable Housing** The Chairman opened the discussion by saying that, after a lengthy period of public meetings and deliberation, it was now time for the Parish Councillors to decide on the way forward. He said the latest report was a little inconsistent in parts compared to earlier ones. *Help to Buy, Home Finder Service* and *Shared Ownership* were all national schemes not exclusively relating to Affordable Housing. All Parishioners have been consulted. He said he wanted all the Parish Councillors to give their views on this important decision. In order to give all Parish Councillors a good chance of discussing and then voting on the matter, a further interim meeting should be called with the Clerk ensuring that the date is convenient to them all. There is a planning application which needs to be considered and which was received too late for that night's meeting, so Monday 6th August was earmarked - to meet at 7.30 p.m. in the village hall.
- **Parish Bridleways** Cllr. Katrine Maxwell said she had been advised that there were gates along the bridleways which are tied shut and causing inconvenience to members of the public in general and horse riders in particular. After a discussion the Clerk was asked to firstly seek guidance from George Montague (SCC footpath officer for the Sedgemoor region) about this, and secondly to look into self-help amongst villagers, a few of whom have already indicated a desire to assist.

Somerset County Council report

Cllr. David Hall reported as follows:

- **Unitary Authority discussions** He said that with the huge amount of funding which the County Council have lost by Central Government withdrawing the old support grant (amounting to £100 million in Somerset's case), and the burden of increased spending on both adult and children's social care, and bearing in mind the considerable savings to be made by amalgamating tiers of local government, it was clearly a sensible idea to at least consider all options. He said nothing has yet been decided and matters are likely to move relatively slowly, so that next year's local government elections will probably not be affected. When asked about the current state of Somerset's financial position, he said that things are understandably very tight, and other county councils are in a similar position.
- **Road Maintenance** This is progressing satisfactorily.
- **Hinkley Point** This is progressing, together with the associated roadworks.

Sedgemoor District Council report

Cllr Liz Perry reported as follows:

She said she had taken up bicycle riding again so she could see more of conditions in the area (and keep fit too!).

- **Affordable Housing** She said she was happy to be consulted as she had some experience from other neighbouring villages on the issue.

Planning

No new Planning Applications but:

Reference: 18/18/00004/DT.

Proposal: Erection of storage building.

Location: Old Rectory Farm, Fry's Lane, TA7 8JW.

Appellant: Mr Farmer.

This application was received too late for inclusion in that night's meeting so it was to be discussed at a special planning/interim meeting on Monday 6th August 2018.

Correspondence

- **Improving Lives Strategy for Somerset** The Clerk read out an email from Cllr. Christine Lawrence (SCC Chair of Health and Wellbeing Board), in which she said they have a vision to improve the lives of all of the residents in Somerset. It is necessary to work together to do this and consider all the influencing factors. Four priorities have been identified as being important to improving the quality of lives in the county. In an attempt to get maximum input from both public bodies and the general public, they are asking us all to complete a short questionnaire online at www.somerset.gov.uk/improvinglives. Consultation closing date Friday 17th August 2018.
- **Legal advice, drafting and representation scheme for Parishes and Town Councils** The Clerk said he had received a letter reminding Parishes that SDC's legal team are offering to carry out legal work for Parishes at a much lower hourly rate than otherwise available, (£100 per hour + vat).
- **CAB Sedgemoor Grant Aid Request** The usual annual appeal for grant aid had been received from the CAB and after a discussion it was proposed by Cllr. Brian Gale and seconded by Cllr. Katrina Maxwell that £50 be sent in. All agreed.

Any Other Business

- **Road Closure Chedzoy Lane** It was reported that the recent road closure in The Lane between Slapes Cross and Temple Farm - when Open Reach were carrying out work - had not been organised correctly and the Parish Council were given no notice of it.
- **Defibrillator "Bleeping"** This continues and is a problem for neighbouring properties to the Village Hall. Following a discussion the Clerk was asked to make enquiries and it was unanimously agreed that the Parish council would meet the cost of a new battery if this was needed (£199 + vat).
- **Flower Show** The Chairman said this recent event was another success and he wished to express the gratitude of the Parish Council to all those who helped in any way.
- **Allotments** In view of the long, hot and dry spell that the country was experiencing, it was agreed that any increased water charges for Allotment water during this period would be met by the Parish Council rather than being passed on to the allotment holders.

Extracts from interim meeting – Monday 6th August

Planning

Application no: 18/18/00004/DT.

Proposal: Erection of storage building.

Location: Old Rectory Farm, Fry's Lane, TA7 8JW.

Applicant: Mr Farmer

The Chairman invited the applicant to outline the proposal. The application is for an aesthetically pleasing two bay open fronted storage building with a tiled roof to be sited in the corner of the field further

along Fry's Lane from Old Rectory Farmhouse, near the corner garden/allotment separated from the field by a hedge. The closest neighbouring property with a clear view of the building is Old Rectory Farmhouse itself. It will house various tractors and play equipment currently stored in a room actually beneath Victory V Cottage, which cannot be let until the store is cleared out as it would represent a health and safety breach.

The Chairman called for a vote and the councillors unanimously supported the application.

The Clerk has subsequently submitted the following comments to the SDC Planners: *Chedzoy Parish Council supports the application on the following valid planning grounds:- No additional traffic will be generated and road safety will be unaffected. The proposed building will not have any detrimental effect on neighbouring properties. There will be no overshadowing, overlooking or loss of privacy involved. The aesthetically pleasing appearance will blend in well with the landscape and no additional noise will be generated.*

Affordable Housing

The Chairman said he felt the matter had been canvassed and discussed at length and he felt it was now time for the councillors to vote on the motion before it: **Does Chedzoy Parish Council agree to tackle the affordable housing shortfall in the Parish?**

A lengthy discussion ensued with each councillor giving their opinion. It was felt the motion was heavily loaded. It was also felt that although some minor individual infilling could be accommodated, any sizeable development, (and any development to include affordable housing will necessarily be sizeable), would severely strain the parish infrastructure, services (such as they are), drainage and flood risk issues. The Dolton's Farm development had only recently taken place. Traffic from the parish and neighbouring parishes is already heavy and could only increase under the scheme. It was felt that, at the end of the day, those parishioners who expressed a need for assistance from affordable housing in the survey may well not be guaranteed to benefit from it.

The public meetings have shown the vast majority of parishioners are vociferously opposed to the plan. Plans such as *Help to buy*, *Shared ownership* and the *Home finder service* were national schemes, available to all and not exclusively related to affordable housing.

The motion was proposed by Cllr. Pat Lennard and seconded by Cllr. Ray Triggol, with the ensuing vote unanimously defeating the motion, with all councillors being opposed to it.

The Clerk was asked to convey the decision to the Affordable Housing team.

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St Margaret's Hospice Community Support Volunteer Service

Do you have a couple of hours to spare on a flexible basis?

Would you like to volunteer in your community?

Could you support our patients and their families in their own home? - if the answer is yes, we need you!

What is our Community Support Service?

It is a home visiting service delivered by trained hospice volunteers and operates across Somerset.

How does the service work?

Volunteers offer their time depending on their availability, usually this involves a visit once a week for a couple of hours during normal working hours Monday to Friday.

Volunteers are assigned a patient who they support over 8 visits, by the end of this time, many patients feel much more confident about living with their illness.

Volunteers will use their own cars to visit patients. However it is not necessary to be a car owner, we welcome volunteers who would be willing to walk, cycle or use public transport. Travel costs are reimbursed.

What can a Community Support Volunteer do?

The support provided is built around supporting patients achieve identified goals. Everyone's needs are different, but the sort of things you can help with include:

- Helping patients find relevant information about benefits and other services
- Accompanying patients to a GP, hospital appointments, shopping
- Taking patients out for a drive or walk
- Talking about planning ahead
- Spending time with patients so that carers, family or friends can have a break

They are not able to provide medical or personal care.
