IRENE MAY REDDING



A service to celebrate and remember 'Rene', who passed away on Monday 2nd March 2015, aged 89 years, was held on Wednesday 18th March at St Mary's Church.

The eulogy – written by Rene's brother and sisters – was read by Rev Chris Keys, and contained the following:

Rene was born in Merridge, and attended Merridge School before going to Spaxton, and then on to Kingstone. When she left school, she went to Cassington House as a cook, then to Mills in Bridgwater to work in the office. During her time there, she was paid on a monthly basis, so when she got home she would have four envelopes into which she divided her monthly pay. She would never take from next week's wages – even if it were for an ice cream! After that she went on to Hoopers Timber offices – where she met her husband-to-be, Syd. Later, after she was married, she went back and worked again at Mills, with Daisy her friend.

After Syd's mother died, she kept both her own and Syd's old home going – working very hard for Syd's dad and two brothers, Jeffery and Gerald. Us girls used to go to Rene's in the summer holidays for a week, and every Monday we had to go over to Mr Redding's house, where she worked hard all day long, before cooking a meal in the evening. When Michael Clarke – Marjory's little boy – was taken into hospital, Rene would go up every day and read him a story.

Sister Chris used to whistle – until one day whilst on holiday, Rene told her that 'A whistling woman is no good to man nor beast!' Chris thought that she had better stop!

Rene was really good at needlework, and also loved cooking. She will be greatly missed by family and friends.

The exit music from the church was *Goodnight Irene* – by Nat King Cole - and friends joined family members for tea, coffee and light refreshments at Chedzoy Village Hall after the interment.

Dear Friends,

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PARISH COUNCIL

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Extracts from meeting held on Tuesday 16th December 2014

Matters arising from previous meeting's minutes

- The Natwest Business Reserve Account was in the process of being closed and the application form for the Cambridge Building Society *Council Notice Saver* account requires completion by Cllrs Patricia Lennard and Martin Baker, who had both agreed to be signatories along with the Clerk.
- The application for grant aid under this year's Health and Wellbeing budget submitted in the sum of £315 for a single tier short mat handling unit had been successful and a cheque for £315 was handed to the chairman. The Clerk to arrange the purchase.
- Speed Indicator Device – review of data captured during the placements in September and October. Cllr Mark Smith presented a very helpful and informative explanation of the data, saying :-
 1. Analysis of the data is limited, because it does not reveal how many vehicles went through at what speed. He believed this was because the data set is considered to be too small for certain statistical techniques.
 2. For both periods the median figure is given. This is not the average speed, but the middle value when all speeds are put in order. This was 32 mph in September and 33 mph in October.
 3. The data also quotes the 85 percentile speed. This is the value below which 85% of all records lie, and 15% above. The top 15% are excluded because they skew the data. For both months, the 85 percentile speed is 39 mph.
 4. The speed limit is 30 mph. The intervention limit for further action is calculated as the current speed limit plus 10% plus 3 mph. For this SID, that is 30 + 3 + 3 = 36 mph.
 5. If the median speed is higher than the intervention limit, then speed is an issue. In both instances the median was 3 mph higher than the intervention limit.
 6. The location therefore qualifies for regular SIDs.

A general discussion took place and it was felt that permanent installation of the equipment would be counterproductive. The possibility of requesting the police to deploy the mobile motorbike unit was considered, as was the revival of the speed watch team. Mr Don Johnson said he had retired from the team but kindly offered to help ease any new volunteer into the post.

The Clerk advised the meeting that the installation dates for 2015 were the weeks commencing 26th January and 13th July and it was decided to wait for the January data to see any continuing trends before deciding on any further action.

County Councillor's report

Cllr. Hall reported on the following items:

- The Government's autumn statement set out sweeping road improvements in our region, including the A303 upgrade and all in all it had exceeded all expectations. The improvements to both tourism and industry would be substantial.
- Flood Prevention Funding. He said that a feasibility study would provide the best way forward. Some interim River Authority funding had been agreed.
- The Government Growth Deal 2 was to come.
- The SCC budget for the coming year was proving challenging and an announcement would be made in the New Year.
- Hinkley Point: - an announcement from the EDF Chief Executive would shortly be made.
- Health and Wellbeing Fund. Distribution to successful applicants was now being made.
- Superfast Broadband rollout. Cllr Hall said there appeared to be an anomaly here, with Chedzoy seeming to fall outside the scope of the *Connecting Devon and Somerset* scheme. With members of the public advising of very slow speeds he said he would continue to make enquiries and the Council decided to authorise the Clerk to lend any support deemed necessary to any letter sent by Cllr Hall to BT on the subject, should this prove necessary before the next meeting. This was proposed by Cllr Bunney seconded by Cllr Lennard with all in agreement.

Planning

No new applications received, but the Chairman invited Mr Mike Horrobin to address the meeting concerning the rejected application he had made for holiday lodges at his property in Chedzoy Lane. He said he

had commissioned a survey which confirmed that the area of his proposed development was **not** in flood area 3, as had been claimed by the planners, but was in fact in area 2. On this basis he was resubmitting the application with a copy of the sequential test results and that, if rejected again, he would take it to appeal.

Correspondence

- St John Ambulance. The Clerk said he had received notification that the certificates issued to the trainees at the training session last March were due to expire after a year. No action proposed

Setting the Precept for 2015/2016. The Clerk explained to members of the public that the precept was the main source of Parish Council funding, and went on to present the forecast Income and Expenditure for the council for the year 2015/2016. He said provision had to be made for the expense associated with an election which may be held in 2015, estimated at £1,500. He suggested that an uplift of £500 in the Precept to £5,500 should prove adequate, as long as the council agreed to utilise up to £1,000 towards any election costs from reserves held at the end of the 2013/2014 financial year. After a discussion it was proposed to apply for a precept of £5,500, and all were in agreement.

Any Other Business

- Potholes. Cllr Triggol had requested this be discussed in his absence and a discussion took place with the public being invited to take part. It was resolved to ask Cllr Smith to report the position to the SCC highways dept. appropriately.
- Mr John Weeks brought up the sorry state of the phone box, letter box and sign post in the centre of the village. It was agreed that refurbishment was needed here and the Clerk was asked to apply to SCC highways (sign post), BT (telephone box) and Post Office (post box) appropriately

Extracts from meeting held on Tuesday 3rd February 2015

Matters arising from previous meeting's minutes

- Cambridge Building Society Council Easy Access Account. The *Council Notice Saver* account for which the parish council had applied had been withdrawn the day before the application had been received, but that the next best alternative- the *Easy Access* account - with a current yield of 0.5 % - had been opened, with some identification issues to be sorted out.
- Short Mat Bowls Handling Unit. The Clerk reported this unit had now been delivered to the village hall
- First Aid Training. The Clerk reported Mrs Maxwell (one of the defibrillator trainees) had asked if it would be in order for the team of volunteers to get together to brush up on their techniques. There was no objection to this.

County Councillor's report

Cllr. Hall reported on the following items:

- Superfast Broadband rollout. There is some good news here. Although Chedzoy is not automatically included in the main roll out scheme, there are funds available under the SFEP programme- the BT extension scheme which should mean the village's inclusion for connection by end 2017 - at the latest. Cllr Hall is currently in discussion with BT at area and regional level to try to get Chedzoy included in the **main** scheme. He would be meeting the company in March. He said he was not yet reverting to writing letters but would keep the council advised and he was aware a joint letter from himself and the parish council was a possibility, if felt necessary.
- SCC budget. He said this had passed the scrutiny stage and would go before cabinet next week and the full council on 18th February. He said that although testing, there were bright spots in that the burden of historic debt dating back to previous administrations was eased with current low interest rates meaning the amount needed to be held back to service the debts was less than otherwise would have been. He did say the area of Creative Arts funding had been hard hit.

- Hinkley Point. The Bridgwater road works were progressing. He emphasised the overall benefit to the local economy resulting from the development could not be overstated.
- There are moves afoot to create an annual *Somerset Day* on 11th May.

Sedgemoor District Council report

Cllr. Derek Alder reported on the following items.

- There would be no overall budget increase this year.
- New Homes Bonus. He explained this was the funding from Central Government paid for new homes built, and that it amounted to £3.6 million in the case of SDC, and that this money had enabled the SDC to make 21 starts to new council homes this year.
- The Bridgwater unemployment rate was the lowest in the south west, economic expansion was high. Sedgemoor had the lowest band D council tax rate in Somerset.
- The Somerset River Relief Fund was up and running.
- He said that Sedgemoor Community Transport could help in the event of vital local bus services being cut, provided there was sufficient demand.

Planning

- Reference:- 18/14/00
 Proposal:- Erection of seven holiday lodges, garages formation of access and parking.
 Location:- Lonsdale Nursery, 3 West End Court, Chedzoy Lane Bridgwater TA7 8QS
 Applicants:- Mr and Mrs M Horrobin.

The Clerk reported receipt of the details of this application on 20th December 2014. He said he consulted with the Chairman and it was deemed unnecessary to call a special planning meeting on the issue as the application was unchanged from that considered last May when a vote resulted in 6 in favour and 1 abstention. Therefore he sent the identical note of support to SDC as had been sent last summer. This note was read to the meeting.

The Clerk reported two objections having been received, the first from Mr Roger Sutton of a neighbouring property to the proposal. Mr Sutton took the view that a new vote should have been taken before such a strong note of support sent in. He said this second application was a *stand-alone* application and, as no vote had been taken, the parish council should withdraw the support recently given, without delay. Mr Medland also voiced very eloquently his opposition to the proposal.

A discussion took place, at the end of which the Chairman asked the Clerk to check up to ensure correct procedures had been followed here, and if so that matters should be left as they are. It was felt that the true consistent view of the council in supporting strongly the proposal reflected the parish council's continuing opinion on the matter.

The Clerk mentioned that he had this very day spoken to Mr Ian Lloyd planning officer assigned to this case, who had confirmed an alteration to the proposal, with the garages now *not* being proposed, which had led to Cllr Nobby Turner's opposition being withdrawn.

The Clerk reported that the Precept of £5,500 for 2015/16 had been applied for, and would be received in two instalments - £4,000 and £1,500.

Any Other Business

- Cllr Baker noted that the drainage ditch in Pig Lane remains blocked.
- Sign post, post box and telephone box. The Clerk to chase up refurbishment here.
- Potholes in Chedzoy Lane. Mr Richard Woodward said he had been advised that the matter had not apparently been reported, Cllr. Baker said the potholes had been outlined for attention for about a week, so things appear to be happening.

Extracts from meeting held on Tuesday 4th March 2015

Matters arising from previous meeting's minutes

- Potholes. The Clerk said Cllr. Mark Smith (pothole liaison officer) had photographed all areas of potholes throughout the village, and supplied detailed location road maps and these had been sent to SCC highways. An e-mail reply was read to the meeting which stated that the worst of these had been repaired (Chedzoy Lane), and that the rest of the village had been inspected and repairs would be dependent on the demands of other areas in the District and the budget provided. The e-mail went on to point out that it is recognised that a Highway Authority cannot be expected to maintain its assets in perfectly smooth condition, so intervention levels are set for the Inspector to identify safety defects.
- Finger post, Telephone Box and Post Box at Cross Tree (in need of repainting/renovation)
 Finger post – the Clerk has reported the poor state of the finger post, as well as the Playing Field sign on the corner of Pig Lane and Manor Road (the latter having been turned round and now unobstructed by the hedge), and the matter of the finger post has been referred to the relevant Highways Office for investigation.
 Telephone Box – the Clerk reported he had received an assurance from BT that repainting would take place sometime between March and October this year.
 Post Box – the Clerk reported receipt of an e-mail from PJ Carter, deliveries office manager, Friarn Street, Bridgwater stating the matter was in the hands of the Post Office Collections Department to establish when repainting/renovation was due.

County Councillor's report - Cllr. Hall was unable to be present.

Sedgemoor District Council report

Cllr. Derek Alder reported on the following items:

- Budget 2015/16. – The increase this year is within the allowable 1.9% figure which would mean a £2.74 annual increase for a band D council tax property.
- A £1 million economic growth fund has been established to assist small businesses wishing to expand but who experienced any reluctance on the part of the banks to provide necessary capital.
- A £500,000 fund has been established to promote apprenticeships in the District.
- Superfast Broadband - Sedgemoor has allocated £340,000 to the fund promoting Superfast Broadband to areas not covered by the main rollout scheme.
- Funds allocated to try to help overcome antisocial behaviour in the District.
- Funds allocated to assist flood relief.
- SDC are arranging for all former and existing council houses to be converted from using septic tanks and on to main sewerage.

Planning

(Cllr. Derek Alder withdrew from the discussion.)

- Reference:- 18/14/00008/IL
 Proposal:- Erection of seven holiday lodges, garages formation of access and parking.
 Location:- Lonsdale Nursery, 3 West End Court, Chedzoy Lane Bridgwater TA7 8QS
 Applicants:- Mr and Mrs M Horrobin.

The Clerk reported there had been amended plans submitted. Following concerns raised within the representations, a number of which state the development appeared to be residential in nature, and that, if approved, this would represent a *back door* way of obtaining consent for residential properties on the site, it was stated that the application is for holiday accommodation, not residential use. The revised plans show garaging and the private driveways being removed and a communal car parking area with a disabled parking space being situated at the entrance. The parking area was to be sympathetically landscaped to minimise the impact on the surrounding countryside. Comments invited by 6th March.

The four councillors present examined the amended plans and compared them with the originals which show the lodges in the same positions as before. A discussion took place and there were no objections to the amended proposal. Cllr Allen said that with the present proposal being so similar to that originally considered (last May), it is entirely appropriate the views expressed back then, and the resultant vote taken,

to remain pertinent. The Clerk to advise that the parish council's view remains as advised on 8th February. Mr Roger Sutton continues to take the view that correct procedures have not been followed and that a further vote should have been taken.

- Certificate of Lawfulness, the Stables West End Farm.
Mr Roger Sutton's accounting business has been utilising this property over a long period. Over the years it has expanded and more people taken on to work there. Although Mr Sutton is now considering retirement, and reducing his working week to just one day, the others will continue in the premises. Sedgemoor planners advise he will need to obtain B1 usage, involving either a *scratch* application or alternatively - given the longstanding existing usage (over a period in excess of 10 years) - a *Certificate of Lawfulness*, which is less cumbersome and would achieve the same ends - hence this application. Mr Sutton expressed surprise that, despite comments being invited up to 9th March, the Parish Council replied in a letter dated 19th February, and in what he felt was a 'churlish' way.
The Parish Council advised SDC that it had no knowledge of the use to which the Stables had been put. Mr Sutton felt a number of councillors *were* aware and he felt a discussion and possibly a vote would have been more appropriate - particularly as there was ample time to reply following this evening's meeting.
The Clerk said that, on receipt of the notification from SDC, he had consulted both the Chairman and vice-Chairman who felt the neutral reply was appropriate.

- AM Sensors Limited.
Mr Sutton outlined a third issue concerning this business operating from the Barn appertaining to West End Farm, which he pointed out had brought benefits of jobs and significant household income to the District, including Chedzoy itself. In order to formalise new working arrangements at the site he said a planning application would be lodged and he hoped the Parish Council would look at this sympathetically when asked for its opinion. Cllr. Allen said the matter could not be prejudged but would be considered at the appropriate time.

- Web activity report – Statistics received and they are being considered.
- SID data report for Higher Road for January/February 2015. Statistics received and these are kindly being examined by Cllr Mark Smith for presentation to the next meeting.
- Parish Council insurance – the Clerk reported that Zurich Insurance had approached him requesting they be allowed to give a quote when the policy with Came and Company comes up for renewal on 1st June.
