COLIN ALBERT HILL

who passed away on 13th September 2018 - aged 84



A service for Colin was held at St Mary's Church on Saturday 6th October, conducted by Revd. Chris Keys. The following eulogy was written by Colin's family and read at the service by Revd. Keys:

Colin was one of five children born to Harry and Bessie. He had three brothers and one sister. Sadly two of his brothers, Brian and Tony, passed away leaving Kenny and Pat. He was born in Chedzoy on 12th of September 1934 and remained there until his illness got the better of him and he had to go to Burnham Lodge Nursing Home, where he passed away.

When he was young he had the job of *pumping the organ* and if he slowed down he received one of those *looks* from the organist. He was always willing to help people, and on one of those occasions helped the blacksmith Percy Tucker install the gates at the church entrance. During Colin's time at Higher Road he tended his garden with love and care. When Pat and her family visited they would always go home with a bag of vegetables from his garden. Colin was so keen on keeping his garden tidy that one day he was burning rubbish and didn't realise he had set the hedge on fire - resulting in the fire brigade being called. He is one of the last villagers of his era to pass away.

Although he never married, Colin had plenty of friends around him. One of his friends would drive him to watch Bristol Rovers play their home matches. His other great love was playing Skittles, and he would cycle to Bridgwater to play in the *Bird in the Hand* pub and have a few pints, knowing he didn't have to drive a car home as he always relied on his bicycle. He never had a holiday and worked first for Bern Stone and then for Ray Triggol - which he thoroughly enjoyed.

His brother Tony used to take him to Pat's home in Wales, where he liked going to Swansea to do a bit of shopping. He always visited Swansea Market and bought himself some fresh fish and Welsh cakes to take home. Colin was at Burnham Lodge Nursing Home for about three years - during which time Kenny, Pat and their families were regular visitors. They would like to take this opportunity to thank the carers for looking after him.

Colin was a much loved member of the community and will be sadly missed by family and friends.

### **Alarming News from St. Mary's**

The theft of lead from church roofs is on the increase, and our insurers have said they will no longer offer full cover unless the roof is protected by an alarm. Although we have more pressing uses for our limited funds, we have regretfully decided that installing an alarm system is the only sensible option.

The roof is now protected by sensors 24/7. When activated, video footage of what's happening will be transmitted automatically to a control centre. If people are on the roof the police will be called and an external siren activated. The footage is automatically recorded and made available to the police to help them identify and catch the thieves.

The lead is also already marked with *SmartWater*, as are all items of value inside the church.

### ***Come Ye Thankful People, Come***

Another Harvest season has come and gone - as you get older they seem to come around more quickly each year! The Church, as usual, was beautifully decorated, with Pauline Clapp's magnificent arrangement of vibrant gladioli and produce on and around the font reflecting another successful Harvest.

### ***Harvest Service***

This was well attended, with Ray Triggol setting the tone with a Harvest Reflection, and Jane Sutton leading the service to bless the donated produce. After the service, members of the congregation lingered to chat over coffee, cake and sausage rolls.

### ***Harvest Auction***

The Auction is, as many of you know, the Church's biggest fundraiser of the year. Rector Chris blessed the harvest and led us in the traditional harvest hymn *We Plough the Fields and Scatter the Good Seed on the Ground*. Then Ray Triggol took over, demonstrating his auctioneering skills honed over many years, showing just how good he is at getting the most out of the generous bidders. Pete Dodge's monster pumpkin, which needed quite a few strong men to move it, took centre stage once again. Bidding was enthusiastic and this year it was knocked down to an impressive £638.

We all took advantage of the bar and enjoyed the crispy roasties, tasty sausages and delicious sandwiches served by Amanda Triggol and Janet Young. Thanks to everyone who organised, helped and donated produce. After a generous donation from the bar, the raffle (£165), and *Guess the Weight of the Pumpkin*, we are delighted to tell you that this year it raised a truly amazing £1,694 (£1,345 in 2017).

### ***Harvest Supper***

This year's Harvest Supper offering of generous helpings of cottage pie with roast potatoes, carrots and peas went down a treat - we served 55 suppers. The Harvest Loaf was blessed and handed round, and after the main course, a selection of puddings - including apple crumble, apple pie, trifle, lemon roulade, cheesecake and pavlova - followed by cheese and biscuits, were served. Everything was donated, which is what makes it such a special community event.

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PARISH COUNCIL

Extracts from meeting - Monday 17th September

Matters arising from previous meeting's minutes

- **Defibrillator bleeping** A new battery has been supplied by St John Ambulance at a cost of £309.60, inclusive of vat.

Correspondence

- **Adopt a Kiosk** The Clerk reported receipt of an email from one of the people who originally made a suggestion on the future use of the Kiosk, asking about the present position as it seems to have fallen away from the minutes. He said he was making enquiries to try to find a volunteer to lead the project (with the full support of the Parish Council). This will be discussed at the next meeting as appropriate.
- **Recent road closures.** A discussion took place regarding the recent road closures in Chedzoy Lane, which do not seem to have been flagged up beforehand. The Chairman stressed that the Parish Council is not consulted and knows no more than the general public about such matters. It was said that emergency closures are permitted by the use of emergency notices. It was also noted that, although the *road closed* signs were displayed for a number of days, the work can often take just a small proportion of the time, and the road actually remains open for the majority of the time.
- **Footpath behind the Church** It was reported that the footpath running around North Field, immediately behind the rear Churchyard wall has been partly cultivated by the landowners, causing difficulty to walkers who now risked losing their footing on the approach to the stile into the churchyard. This walk is well used. The PPLO has reported this but he also points out that a right of way is just that, and is not any guarantee of the footpath condition, although there would seem to be a clear Public Liability and/or a Health and Safety issue here.
- **Somerset Policing Reorganisation** The Clerk read a letter from Chief Inspector Lisa Simpson, Somerset West LPA Commander based in Bridgwater, which sets out the impending reorganisation of policing in the Bridgwater and surrounding area. Planning

No new Planning Applications but:

- Mr Baker's appeal reference APP/V3310/W/18/3197333 has been allowed by the Planning Inspector. The Chairman wished to record that correct procedure had been followed.
- Mr Farmer's application reference 18/18/00004/DT has been granted on a delegated basis

Finance

Details of various cheques issued were given.

HMRC have advised the Payroll Lady that the Parish Council have made an overpayment of PAYE of £114.40.

The amenity grants are being frozen at last year's levels as, due to an administrative error, they have in the past been up-rated by 5% per year instead of the intended 2.5%. The recipients are being advised of this.

Any Other Business

- **De-silting work at Parchey Bridge and Dunball Railway Bridge.** The Clerk read an email from John Rowlands of the Environment

Agency describing this work which starts this month as part of a package of work following the 2013/14 flooding in Somerset. Funding is to come via Somerset Rivers Authority who successfully bid for the money from the Heart of the South West Local Enterprise Fund.

- **Your say on how your Council Tax is spent.** Sedgemoor District Council wants residents to have their say on how SDC spends its proportion of the Council Tax, in its annual budget consultation. The budget cycle starts now with the final decisions being taken in mid-February 2019. A questionnaire is available to complete at :- <http://www.sedgemoor.gov.uk/budgetconsultation>
- **Free Woodland Mix bulbs.** Sedgemoor are again this year offering 25kg bags of spring flowering bulbs to Town and Parish Councils. The Clerk has registered an interest.
- **Fingerpost restoration.** A letter has been received about the sorry state of the fingerpost on Cross Tree, which was last restored some 14 years ago. There was an initiative recently by SCC to set up a team of trained volunteers who would be allowed to carry out such work. The Clerk was asked to enquire about this.
- **Grass verge in Manor Road by Front Street** A complaint has been received about the overgrown weeds now filling this verge. The grass appears to have died away. It was decided to make some enquiries about the ownership.
- **Litter Pick** It has been suggested there is a need for an annual litter pick to be carried out as seems to happen in some Polden villages. A discussion took place around the difficulties of attracting volunteers as well as the inherent difficulties of Public liability insurance, particularly as the main areas of need would seem to be narrow roads with the inevitable corners which combine to represent a big safety risk. It was decided to ask if the matter could be included as an item in *Chedzoy News* with villagers perhaps being encouraged to tidy up the area around their own homes, and at their own risk.
- **Bridleway gates refurbishment.** This problem was again discussed. There does seem to be a move to form a *self-help* team to undergo the process of obtaining landowners' permission and appeal for some financial help from them (they are after all technically supposed to maintain these gates), with the aim of carrying out the necessary work. The Parish Council may well be approached for limited financial support and the Chairman said that so long as others chipped in and money was raised independently in the village, then he saw no reason why some support could be considered favourably.

Extracts from meeting - Monday 15th October

Matters arising from previous meeting's minutes

- **Adopt a Kiosk** The Clerk said he had received an email from the lady who had expressed an interest in this project but saying she had decided not to take part. There is, however another lady who originally responded to our appeal for ideas, and the Clerk was asked to contact her and enquire if she is still interested.
- **Fingerpost Restoration** The Clerk reported SCC had replied to his communication (requesting guidance), to say volunteers from the Parishes were being sought to be trained by SCC, following which they would be allowed to inspect and carry out superficial restoration to the fingerposts (e.g. cleaning and painting). Any more substantial renovation would be carried out by qualified contractors, funded by the Parish Council. No volunteers had come forward and the Chairman said he would look into the possibility of a basic clean-up of the local fingerpost.

Sedgemoor District Council report

Cllr Derek Alder reported as follows:

- **SDC loan to Eastover Hotel** In view of the rumours and misinformation around, Derek wished to point out that the loan recently agreed for the completion of the project was on commercial terms and agreed over a fixed period. SDC are not allowed to borrow to pay for services. The loan mentioned does not involve taking funds from other service funding.
- **Former Cattle Market.** Development is progressing with 129 new homes planned, the first 20/30 of which will be of modular construction.

- **Single occupancy accommodation.** There are 470 young people in Sedgemoor requiring accommodation and currently on the waiting list.
- **Former Cellophane site.** The pods are to accommodate EDF employees and after 10 years they will *go back*.
- **Penel Orliu/ Old Odeon Cinema shops.** Derek said that, after a great deal of investigative work, Sedgemoor served notice on the owners only to be told the property had been sold on for £1, to unknown owners.
- **SDC Local Plan (up to 2032).** The Chairman said the consultation period ended on 10th October 2018.

Planning

Reference: 18/18/00006

Proposal: Erection of a single storey extension to NE elevation

Location: The Shires, West End Cottages, Chedzoy Lane TA7 8QS

Appellant: Mr Horrobin

The Clerk displayed a full set of paper plans which were examined by the councillors. This is for a dining room extension and there are no comments from neighbours. It appears to be slightly larger than that which would be allowed under *Permitted Development*. The property is in flood zone 1. The Chairman called for a vote and the councillors voted unanimously to support the application. The Clerk to advise the SDC Planning Department appropriately.

Correspondence

- **Village Agent Scheme funding** The Clerk reported that the Community Council for Somerset (CCS) were celebrating having successfully secured a third round of Big Lottery Funding for the Somerset Village Agent Scheme, which will fund the scheme for a further 3 years. The SCC also contribute to this. After a discussion Cllr Pat Lennard offered to invite Vanda Squire to a future PC meeting to give a talk.
- **NALC Star Council Awards** NALC Star Council Awards are the only awards in England to recognise the achievements of the local council sector. On 14th September the judging panel selected this year's finalists and Watchet town council are among them. The Public are invited to vote for the winner at:

- **Scam Mail** Royal Mail are appealing for the help of the public in raising awareness of scam mail in local communities. - **Let Communities Decide** The Parish Council have been asked to support the anti-fracking movement. Some time ago Chedzoy Parish Council indicated its support and now there is a move to allow exploratory drilling under *Permitted Development*. Following a discussion it was felt appropriate for the Chairman to complete a petition on the Parish Council's behalf.
- **Affordable Housing.** The Clerk reported he had received a response to his email of 7th August to Esther Carter, advising her of the Parish Council's decision not to progress in this field. The reply came from Nick Draper, Housing Development Officer Housing Health and Wellbeing, in which he clarified that under the emerging Local Plan, any development in a Tier 4 settlement requires a local lettings policy to be applied for the duration that any new development exists (in perpetuity).
A full discussion took place and the Clerk was asked to reply to the email stating further consideration had been given, but the Parish Council felt it did not warrant it to change its mind. It is felt that very careful consultation and consideration and discussion had been had on the subject and in all the circumstances there is no change in the Council's position.

- **Hedgerows.** A complaint has been received about the state of the hedges, particularly in Ward Lane, following the recent trimming by landowners. It was agreed a very poor job had been done, with all the mess just being left to obstruct the roadway. After a discussion the Clerk was asked to write to the offending landowners about the problem.

- **Bulk Buy Fuel** In an endeavour to alleviate the hardship caused by householders having to pay for oil central heating fuel *up front*, and bearing in mind the last several years of minimal pay increases, and the freezing of some in-work benefits, a scheme is available for interest free loans of up to £500 repayable over 6 months.  - Missed or incomplete collections are due mainly to staff shortages, particularly of drivers.
 - Recycle inserts are available for insertion in new residents' welcome packs (n/a in the case of Chedzoy).
 - Christmas collection details are on display.
- **Sedgemoor in the Pink for Breast Cancer Care** Staff members and councillors at SDC raised over £370 on Friday 12th October in support of Breast Cancer Care.
- **Dog Dirt** A request was made for a dog litter bin. After a discussion it was decided that the associated expense could not be justified. It was felt that dog owners should bag it and take it home.
- **Local Plan Proposed Main Modifications** The Chairman wished to record his thanks to Andy Reading of SDC for providing him with these modifications which will continue to be most useful in the future.
