Community 20mph Speed Limits

At a cost of over £15,000 to the residents of Chedzoy, it was deemed not to progress with a scheme.

Footpath Officer's Report

It was asked if footpath walkers could take with them, secateurs to cut back brambles and intruding growth from the hedges in order that he can concentrate on ground level vegetation clearance.

Parish Council Vacancy

Following the resignation of Karen Medland, there is a vacancy to serve on the Parish Council. (*Anyone know of a person that would like to join the Parish Council. Please let Chris Fry, Clerk, know. His contact details on the back sheet*).

Frequency of Grass Verge Cutting

Class 'C' and unclassified roads were only programmed for one cut per year.

Village Design Statement


